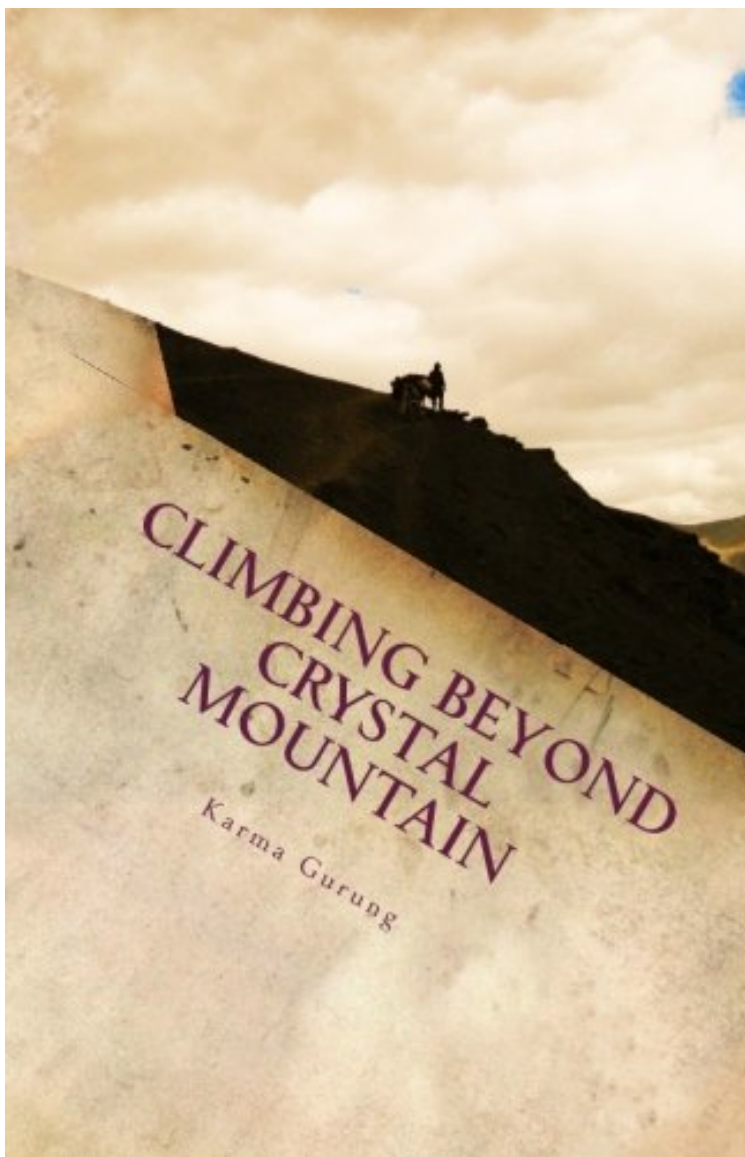

say this. I really, really wanted to like this story. If the summary had been true, this could have been a great book. In reality, its only redeeming feature was its brevity. The author is a terrible writer (to be fair, this is probably because he is not a native English speaker), but where is the editor? The book was repetitive and really quite dull, focusing on small details of the journey, because there wasn't much of a story to tell. For one thing (spoiler alert!), the author was NOT "lost in the middle of hundreds of deserted mountains, alone." His entire period of being "lost" was a few hours on a single day! and he was not only immediately found, he was led directly back to his father. There was no discernible narrative arc. Even the thread of trying to help the local school, which could have redeemed the story, simply ended with him walking away. I do not understand all the positive reviews of this little book. I love adventure, mountains, stories of resilience and human endeavor. This book was all false advertising, and while I found the author a sympathetic character, this story should have been told in a brief essay, written by someone else.
