It was written by a renowned New York Bookseller and Collector. There is a lot of what is covered in the book that is still pertinent today; but the Internet has made a humongous change whether one is an amateur or an expert. Gone are the days where most books were bought at a new or used bookstore. If you wanted out of print books, booksellers published catalogues of their better books or would search other booksellers to find them for you. Now if you want a book that is out of print or rare; you simply go to the net and you will likely find it offered by many sellers at various prices. So, instead of a single bookseller in a small town, or hundreds in a large city, there are now many hundreds of thousands offering their books on the Net. This is also true for just about anything you choose to buy, sell or collect. I have been collecting books for over 50 years, living in the time of bookstores, catalogues etc, so this book from 1979 brought back many memories of how things used to be. The author Arthur H Minters was born in New York in 1932, and spent a lifetime buying, selling and collecting books. It appears he has sold his bookstore in New York, moved to St. Petersburg Florida and is still an Antiquarian Bookseller. For anyone who loves "Books about Books" this is a real gem. The book includes an Appendix of Collector's Associations, Professional Associations, Auction Houses, Book

Museums, Special Libraries and Exhibition Centers. There is also an excellent Glossary of terms and abbreviations used in describing books. Finally there is a Bibliography of some important Trade and Collector's Journals, Directories, Reference Works, and Books About Book Collecting. And of course, a detailed Index.
