

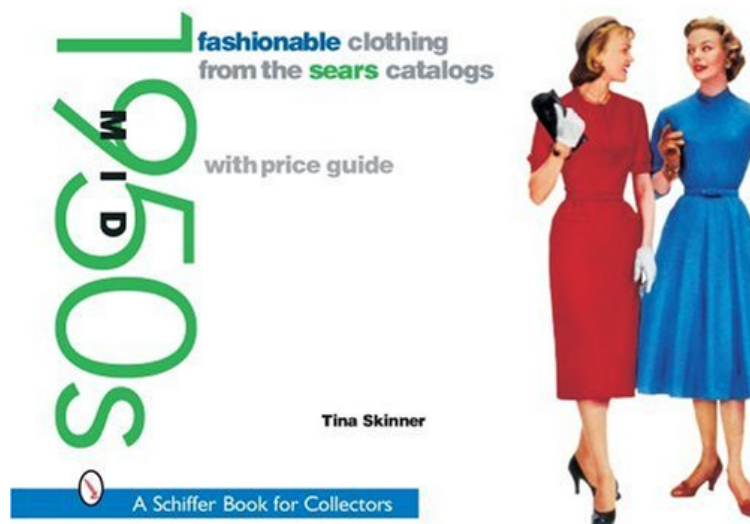

Most fashion books only portray the avant-garde styles of particular eras, while this series focuses on what people in America wore every day, which is far more informative as far as historic clothing styles are concerned. This particular book on the Mid-1950s is as wonderful as every other book in the series. It contains five chapters on fashions for Women, Teen Girls, Men, Teen Boys, and Children. The clothing for women and teen girls takes up more than half the book, of course, but there are a lot of examples of clothing styles for men and children as well. Because of the time period, most photos are a sepia-tone, but there are also a great many color photos throughout the book. The excellent photos and accompanying descriptions depict all types of fashion: dresses, suits, pants, jeans, coats, swimwear, undergarments, shoes, gloves, hats, purses and other accessories. It is nice to see references to particular styles of clothing and fabrics you may have heard about, but not known how they appeared, such as Peter Pan collars, pedal pushers, "shortigans," boucle wool, and poodle-cloth. In my opinion, 1950s fashion was by far the most tasteful and lovely of any decade, and books on this era are hard to find. Instead, they've opted to put the dates at the beginning of the book AND THEY ARE NOT

ACCURATE! The dating page at the beginning of the book goes up to page 619 The issue is that THERE ARE ONLY 160 PAGES in the entire book! It doesnt take a genius to see that this makes absolutely no sense So, unless you already have a really good eye, youll never know if the photo youre looking at is from 1954 or 1957 So, this reference is absolutely useless for someone who relies on pinpoint accuracy! It was obviously a rushed publication It's a shame considering all the previous books leading up to Mid 1950's are great!On another note, as a vintage clothing collector and seller, my advice is to NEVER trust a "price guide"...
