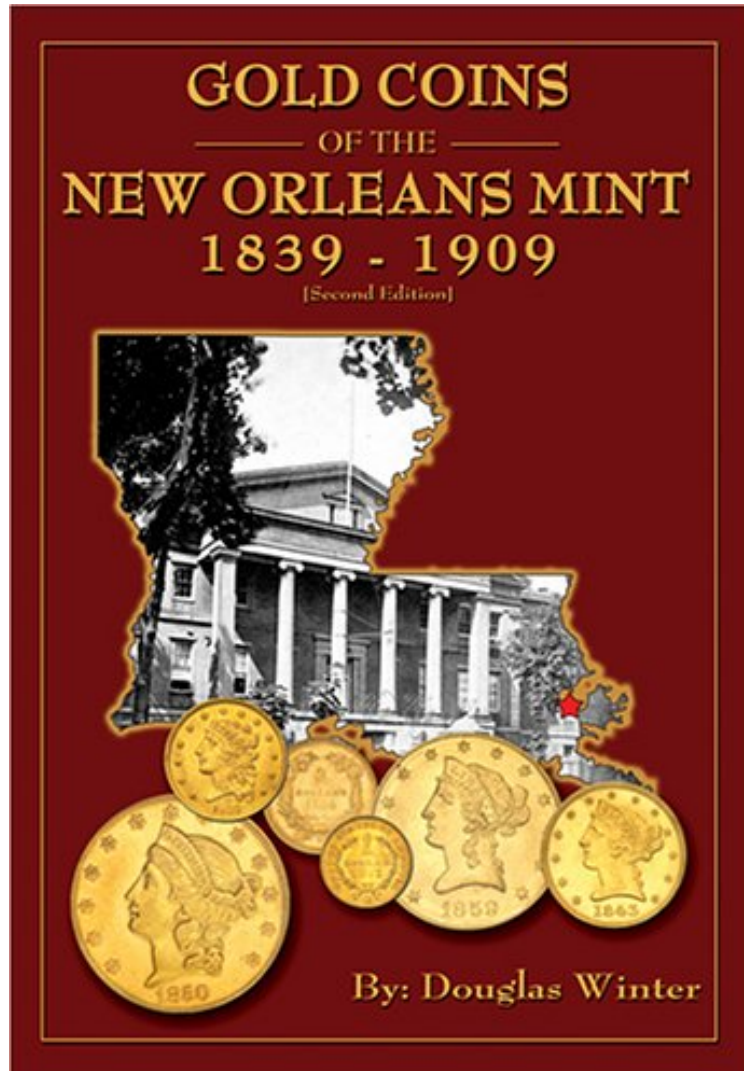

I just received it and I am all over it. The author has vast experience writing numismatic reference books and he really put his knowledge to work when he created this. This is the kind of reference that is immediately useful to anybody who wishes to begin or continue to collect gold coins struck by the New Orleans mint. He has created an entry for every gold coin struck by the mint and in it discusses strike characteristics, varieties, gives population estimates by grade and notes significant auction results. He also assigns relative rarity within the class to each coin.For those who want more information, the book does

include two prefatory essays about 1) The history of the Louisiana Mint and 2) how gold coins from such a mint were used. However, there is no discussion of the underlying coin designs themselves. This must be found in a broader reference about gold coinage itself. I'm not sure that this detracts from the book but it does render the book most useful to the specialist collector. It occurs in approx. 237 pps. with color reproductions of each of the coins it covers, and it covers all of the gold coin issues of the New Orleans mint. Could it have been more lavishly illustrated? Yes. Does it need to be? No. This is the Second edition, published in 2006, so it is possible that a third edition is just around the corner. I wouldn't wait. This is one of the easiest, most useful coin reference books I've encountered and I like it so much I just purchased the Dahlonega Mint book. Very exciting. Furthermore, this edition will still be extremely interesting as a companion piece to the next edition because it will help to reveal clues about the ultimate extant populations of these coins. 7 of 7 people found the following review helpful. I have already commented on his work on Dahlonega gold and I stand behind my critical comments on the photos. Whether the original pictures were good is beside the point. We can only judge the work we have in front of us and that work had lousy quality pictures regardless of who was responsible. Intent is nothing in this regard; finished product is everything. His work on CC gold was much better, for although again no pictures were in color, nevertheless the quality of them was good. Here, however, all things come together to produce an excellent work. The population analysis, the discussion on strike, luster, etc. are everything we have come to expect from the foremost expert on gold coins. I consider this book invaluable whenever I consider buying New Orleans gold and consult it religiously before making a purchase. The photos are excellent, are all in color, and provide a succulent icing on an already delectable cake.
