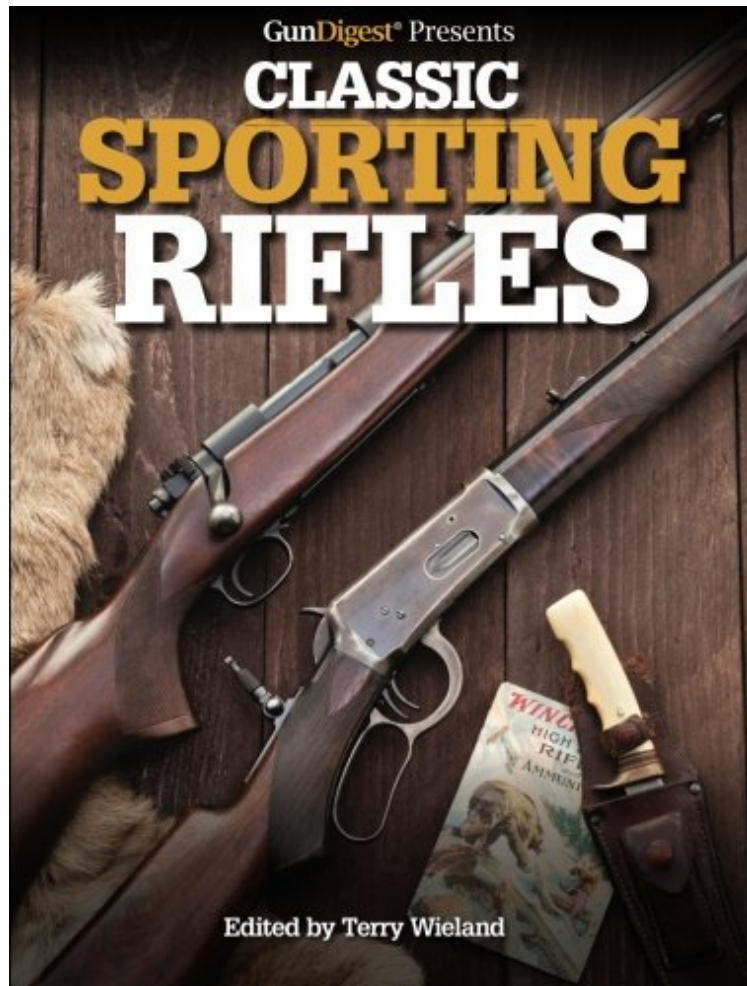

Your average magazine today will cost \$4 to \$8 and I feel this book is worth in that price range.The paper is of a very low quality, lower quality than today's paperback books but better than newspaper paper. The soft cover is very thin.The photo's inside are of such poor quality -- lack of focus, overall dark with shadows that I would be hard pressed to even tell you if the man in one chapter is the same man in another chapter.The book is well organized -- single shot rifles in one chapter, lever actions in another, double rifles in another.As the other reviewer stated, your dealing with a lot of 1950, 1960, and 1970 data. That can be a good thing if you are pursuing rifles from those decades.But this is not a collectible book based on the overall low quality of the materials used to create the book.A bit
