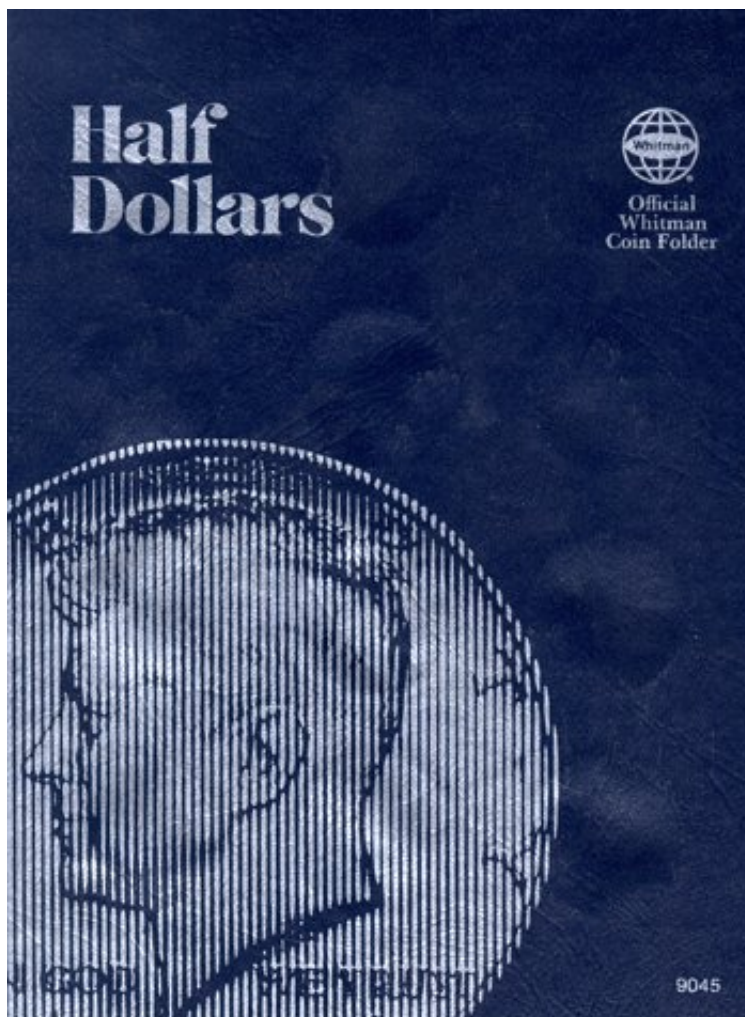

Just use your imagination (and find the appropriate coins to fill it).You could use it to store all your "plain no date" half dollars (the ones worn down so far you can't tell the date), but that's not really what they mean by the title and those sometimes might be a little loose for the book and end up falling out of it into the sofa cushions. You can do better than that: put whatever US half dollar coins you fancy into it, in whatever order you want them to be, and if you want, you can even write a description (date,

mint mark etc.) on the book interior surface above or below the corresponding coins. I bought 2 folders to hold all of them and have room to continue collecting in the future. I followed directions when inserting the coins but was unsuccessful getting the coins "locked " in. Consequently I used a hammer and small block of wood wrapped in Kleenex to insert coins into slots. The good thing is that the coins will probably not fall out.
