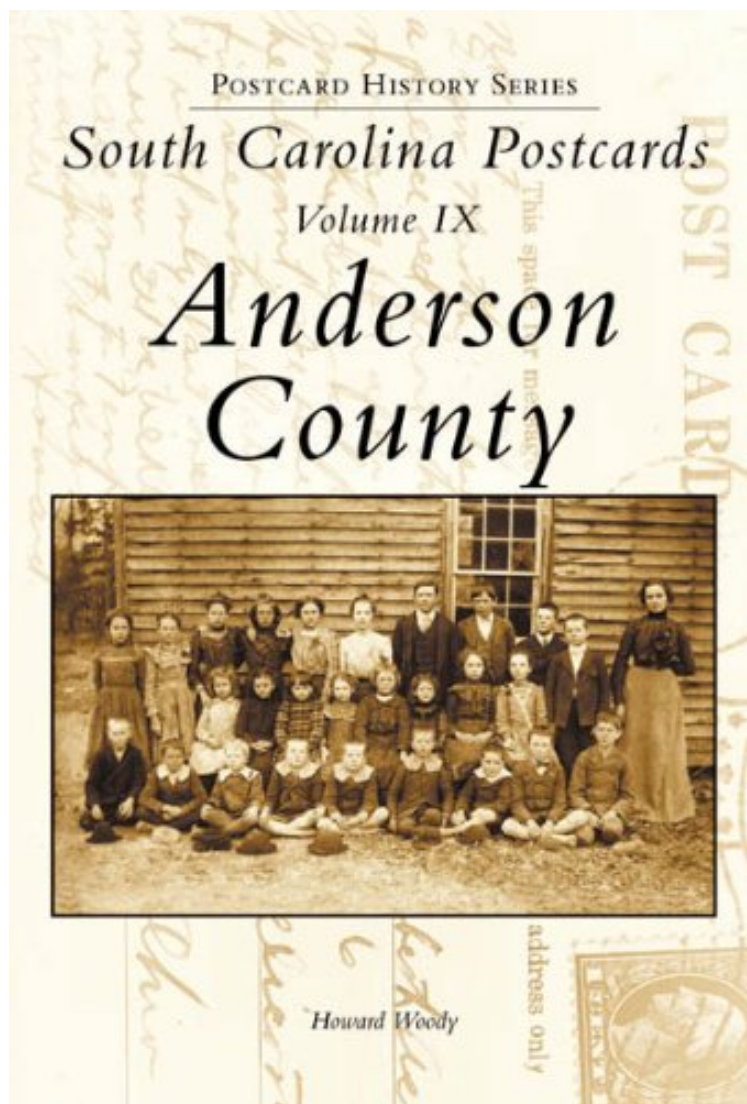

Great for the images, but...By CJWhile this book is fantastic for the images in it, when it came to the descriptions, it felt somewhat hastily thrown together. I found one large error in one of the captions that could have easily been fact checked which made me question the accuracy of other captions for images I knew less (or in some cases, nothing) about. Ultimately, if all you're looking for is pictures, you'll be happy with this book. If you're looking for the story behind the pictures, pick this up from a library and be prepared to find other sources for the actual information.

Revolutionary War general Robert Anderson is honored today in northwestern South Carolina through two namesakes: Anderson County and its county seat, also called Anderson. The town was the Palmetto State's first with long-run electrical power, and it therefore earned the early nickname of "The Electric City." Smaller towns in the county, including Belton, Honea Path, Piedmont, Pelzer, Pendleton, and Williamston, developed around depots serving the Greenville and Columbia Railroad.
