Certainly it is the most definitive work on the subject for collectors. However, it could (and should) be of interest to other groups as well. Students of the great Depression tend to deal in the abstract. They read books and take tests, but they seldom hold a tangible relic of the event. Every state is represented demonstrating the breadth of the Depression. Finally, people interested in local history are certain to be interested. They can usually find notes from their home town. If not, then neighboring towns are certain to be listed. For myself, I used it to help me with research on a small, regional security printing firm (E. A. Wright Bank Note Company of Philadelphia). Finally, it is just interesting to look at the wide array of emergency notes that were issued.
